Race HQ and Race Check In

- **New for 2024:** New Race HQ and Check in at the GAA Club in Laragh, Co.Wicklow
- Eircode for Race HQ is **A67 NP22**
- This is easily accessed from Junction 8 (Kilmacacanogue) from the N11 South. Follow directions for Glendalough/Laragh. Turn left at Lynhams in Laragh village – direction Rathdrum. GAA Club is two hundred metres on the right.
- Race HQ will be open from 0800hrs to 0930hrs.
- There will be ample parking available around the GAA Club and free car park beside the club. We ask all participants to follow all marshal instructions and not to block any entrances.
- Portable toilet facilities will be located at the GAA Club and in free car park.
- The events are run in accordance with Cycling Ireland Covid protocols and all participants are asked to familiarise themselves with all measures at www.cyclingireland.ie

SAFETY/I.C.E.

*Safety Officer **Liam Murphy** (Ph. 086 8964359) kindly asks that you pay special attention to the following. Any queries can be raised with Liam either in advance of Sunday 7th or at the race briefing on the day.*

A full team leader and race participant briefing will take place on Sunday morning before the races start.

With this in mind, all participants should arrive in good time.

Standard race rules and rules of the road apply

Whilst there are several lead cars, **this is not a closed circuit.**

All participants and team members should be fully familiar with the route of the race (see Race Route and maps). Please note there is a change in the route after Meetings of the waters – for 2024, follow the main road R752.

Particular attention should be drawn to the route leaving the Laragh GAA club.

You are asked to obey all marshal instructions – the race organisers and marshals are there for **your** safety.

Ambulance and Gardaí will be in attendance in both races.

Once you have finished your race, the Race Committee kindly ask that the finish area at the Elliott finish is kept completely clear of personnel and vehicles – it is a narrow, busy road and can be very easily blocked which can put other riders in danger. Head to Laragh GAA Club for refreshments and prize giving.

Prize Giving will be at the GAA clubhouse approx. 60 minutes after the end of each respective race.

Prime and KOM will be awarded in both races, with 1st to 12th in the Shay Elliott race, and 1st to 6th in the Ken Duff race.

In addition, A2, ladies and unplaced BWCC rider prizes will be awarded.
